*Orthoptera Metamorphosis*, 1976, 16 mm, color, silent, camera: P.E.L. An animated film. Undergoing conservation.

St. George and the Dragon, 1978, super-8, color, sound added, camera: P.E.L. A film with animated sculptures, an Elephant Hawk moth plays the Maiden. Undergoing conservation.

*The Box*, 1979, super-8, color, sound added, camera: P.E.L., performer: Neil Cumming. A performance addressing the futility of encaptured royalty. Undergoing conservation.

*Cellophane Lair*, 1979, 16 mm, b/w positive. A performance with Barbara Carlile staged in a barn in Kent, England. Undergoing conservation

In Tribute to Madame de Pompadour and the Court of Louis XV [first version], 1984, 16 mm, b/w, silent. Filmed as a performance at the Royal College of Art, London. Undergoing conservation.

The installation *In Tribute to Madame de Pompadour and the Court of Louis XV* is an elaborate machine evoking a celebration of the Enlightenment in eighteenth-century France, focusing on the cultural, economic, and political systems at Versailles, particularly Madame de Pompadour's relationship to Louis XV and his various courtiers. When operative, live bees and snails operate the machine's conical structure. Bees produce the society's cultural wealth (honey) while the snails (courtiers) consume and distribute it for various physical and symbolic purposes. The machine is an intricate model of a society, one incapable of sustaining itself or growth, a metaphoric illusion of a thwarted paradise.

In Tribute to Madame de Pompadour and the Court of Louis XV, [second version], 1985, super-8, b/w positive, camera: P.E.L., performance of Bach's Serenades by Nick Wilson, original sound lost. Filmed over three weeks at Kettle's Yard, Cambridge, England. Undergoing conservation.

*Diametrical Opposites*, 1989–90, super-8, b/w positive, silent, camera: P.E.L. A film of New York City's extremes. Undergoing conservation.
